

Condo New York is an art fair with a difference. Instead of the powerhouses of the art world represented in a prestigious, expensive exhibition hall, this fair promotes smaller galleries: those that are just starting out or have been established for a while but not as well-known to the public. The innovative collaboration sees local galleries offer part or all of their spaces to others in the profession at a low cost, providing access to New York City's art-loving public. In return, the guest and host galleries strengthen ties between artists and dealers on a national and international level. By combining their resources and knowledge, smaller galleries have a better chance to gain notice in the national and international market. This is radically different from a traditional art fair where fees for entry, transport, and set up can be prohibitive to a new gallery's budget.

Galleries from Detroit, Los Angeles, Mexico City, Dublin, Berlin, and Paris among others are just some of the participants ready to show New York their best and brightest artists. Check them out and try to spot the next big name to break into the ultra competitive world of modern art.
